Public Notice Invitation for Bids

The Kinney County will receive bids for installation of water line, booster pumps including pressure tanks and controls, check valves, one emergency generator, and all associated appurtenances, location of site is North off Spring Street onto Ranch Road 2804 at the site of the existing Water Station, until 5:00 PM on February 24, 2023 at 501 S. Ann Street, Brackettville, Texas 78832. Bids may be mailed to Judge John Paul Schuster, PO Box 348, Brackettville, Texas 78832. The envelope must be clearly marked on the outside with "Booster Station Bid". Emailed bids will be accepted and may be sent as a .pdf attachment to your email to Judge John Paul Schuster at county.judge@co.kinney.tx.us with "Booster Station Bid" in the subject line. The bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at 9:30 AM on February 27, 2023 in the Kinney County District Courtroom, 501 S. Ann Street, Brackettville, Texas 78832.

Bids are invited for several items and quantities of work as described in the bid contract documents, drawings and specifications as needed to complete the project. Bid/Contract Documents, including Drawings and Technical Specifications are on file at the Kinney County Judge's office at 501 S. Ann Street, Brackettville, Texas 78832. Drawings and specifications will be distributed by email or electronic download. A bid bond in the amount of 5 percent of the bid issued by an acceptable surety shall be submitted with each bid that exceeds \$100,000. A certified check or bank draft payable to the Kinney County or negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (as par value) may be submitted in lieu of the Bid Bond.

Attention is called to the fact that not less than, the federally determined prevailing (Davis-Bacon and Related Acts) wage rate, as issued by the Texas Department of Agriculture Office of Rural Affairs and contained in the contract documents, must be paid on this project. In addition, the successful bidder must ensure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual identity, gender identity, or national origin.

The Kinney County reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informalities in the bidding.

Bids may be held by Kinney County for a period not to exceed 30 days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of reviewing the bids and investigating the bidder's qualifications prior to the contract award.
