**ORDER ALTERING SPEED LIMITS  
ON CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS**

On the 14th day of August, 2023, after due notice as required by law, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, meeting in regular session, took up for consideration and action the following matter: Alteration of a Prima Facie Speed Limit on Certain County Roads.

WHEREFORE, State law provides, in § 545.351 of the Texas Transportation Code that an operator may not drive at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the circumstances then existing, and

WHEREAS, State law provides, in § 545.355 of the Texas Transportation Code, authority for the Commissioners Courts of Texas to alter prima facie speed limits on roads outside of a municipality and officially designated as a county road, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 233 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 233 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 233 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 234 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 234 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 234 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 237 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 237 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 237 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 30 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 243 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 243 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 243 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 244 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 244 is unreasonable and unsafe,



IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 244 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 245 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 245 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 245 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 30 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 246 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 246 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 246 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 30 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 252 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 252 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 252 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.



WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 253 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 253 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 253 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 30 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 254 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 254 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 254 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 30 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 261 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 261 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 261 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 262 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and



WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 262 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 262 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 263 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 263 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 263 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 264 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 264 is unreasonable and unsafe,

IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 264 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, has determined that the prima facie speed limit on County Road 271 is currently 60 miles per hour based on its properties and the definitions found in § 545.352, and


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Live Oak County, Texas, pursuant to that authority, finds that the prima facie speed limit for County Road 271 is unreasonable and unsafe,


IT IS THEREFORE ADJUDGED, DECREED AND ADJUDGED that the maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limit on County Road 271 in Live Oak County, Texas, shall be 40 miles per hour.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that signs reflecting these maximum prima facie reasonable and prudent speed limits shall be posted on appropriate county roads, and that such speed limits may be enforced by any and all law enforcement officers of the State of Texas in conformity with State law as a Class C misdemeanor, pursuant to § 542.301, Texas Transportation Code. A person convicted of a violation of the speed limits imposed by this Order may be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00), and not more than two-hundred dollars (\$200.00), plus any costs of court pursuant to § 542.401, Texas Transportation Code.
